Avatar

2009 - 162 minutes - PG-13 (Sci-Fi Fantasy)

Saturday, July 3, 7:15 (PMR)

Disabled Marine Jake Sully (Sam Worthington) travels to planet Pandora to become an avatar, ingratiate himself with the natives and help Americans mine lucrative unobtainium. But he finds himself in an interstellar conflict after falling for Na'vi warrior Neytiri (Zoe Saldana). James Cameron writes and directs this Golden Globe-winning CGI odyssey that has broken box office records. Sigourney Weaver and Stephen Lang co-star.

Carmen Jones

1954 - 105 minutes - Not Rated (Classics)

Wednesday, July 7, 7:15 (PMR)

After the beautiful but troublemaking Carmen Jones (Dorothy Dandridge) sets her sights on military pilot-in-training Joe (Harry Belafonte), he leaves his girl, deserts the Army and ultimately kills a man, prompting the couple to flee from justice. But soon, the tragic events they've set in motion come full circle. Otto Preminger directs this Golden Globe-winning adaptation of the stage musical, which in turn is based on Georges Bizet's opera "Carmen."

But Jake is married, and Jane is embarking on a new romance with her architect, Adam (Steve Martin). Now, she has to sort out her life -- just when she thought she had it all figured out. Nancy Meyers writes and directs this Golden Globe-nominated comedy.

Sleepless in Seattle

1993 - 105 minutes - PG (Romance)

Fate and a tenacious 8-year-old boy conspire to unite lovelorn widower Sam Baldwin (Tom Hanks) and unhappily engaged Annie Reed (Meg Ryan) in

Nora Ephron's Oscar-nominated romantic comedy, inspired by the 1957 classic *An Affair to Remember*. When Annie hears Sam and his young son, Jonah (Ross Malinger), on a call-in radio show, she thinks she's found her soul mate. Jonah knows Annie is the one, but convincing his dad could take a little work.

Sherlock Holmes

2009 - 128 minutes - PG-13

(Action - Adventure)

Wednesday, July 21, 7:15 (PMR)

Robert Downey Jr., in a Golden Globe-winning role, stars as the legendary London sleuth Sherlock Holmes, joined by Jude Law as Dr. Watson, in this Guy Ritchie-helmed reinvention of Sir Arthur Conan Doyle's detective series. Based on a comic book by producer Lionel Wigram, the story follows Holmes and Watson as they face off against the villainous Blackwood (Mark Strong). Rachel McAdams co-stars as sharp beauty Irene Adler.

The Desert Fox

1951 - 91 minutes - Not Rated (Classics)

Saturday, July 24, 7:15 (PMR)

Field Marshal Erwin Rommel (convincingly portrayed by James Mason) was known for his exploits in the Afrika Korps. This classic film, directed by Henry Hathaway, chronicles Rommel's life -- including his military career, his contribution to supposed attempts on Adolf Hitler's life and his lonely demise. Jessica Tandy co-stars as Rommel's wife.

For All Mankind

1989 - 80 minutes - Not Rated

(Documentary)

Wednesday, July 28, 7:15 (PMR)

Director-journalist Al Reinert sifted through 6 million feet of film and 80 hours of interviews with astronauts to deliver a dazzling, Oscar-nominated documentary chronicling the American space program and its rush to put a man on the moon. With Brian Eno's atmospheric score, the film uncovers vibrant, never-before-seen footage of the space race, which ended in 1969 when Apollo 11 fulfilled President John F. Kennedy's challenge to NASA.

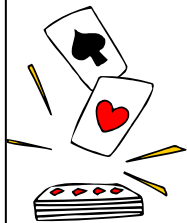
