June Movies

Jane Eyre

1996 - 116 minutes

Wednesday, June 2, 7:15 (PMR)

Director Franco Zeffirelli cemented his reputation as a faithful custodian of the classics with this adaptation of Charlotte Brontë's masterpiece *Jane Eyre*, the story of an orphan (Anna Paquin) forced to endure life at a harsh boarding school. As Jane grows into an independent, strong-willed woman (Charlotte Gainsbourg), she takes a governess job at Thornton Hall and falls in love with the estate's brooding owner, Mr. Rochester (William Hurt).

Show Boat

1951 - 107 minutes

Saturday, June 5, 7:15 (PMR)

Married entertainers (Ava Gardner and Robert Sterling) are forced to leave the showboat Cotton Blossom because of the wife's mixed blood. The captain's daughter (Kathryn Grayson) and gambler Gaylord Ravenal (Howard Keel) take over the act, fall in love, marry and leave the boat for Chicago. There, they live off his gambling earnings, which dry up fast. Jerome Kern and Oscar Hammerstein provide the score for this adaptation of the Broadway hit.

Harry and Tonto

1974 - 115 minutes

Wednesday, June 9, 7:15 (PMR)

Ripping a page from John Steinbeck's novel *Travels with Charley*, this bittersweet comedy follows an old codger named Harry (Art Carney) as he takes a cross-country trip with his cat, Tonto, as a companion. The film, which earned TV comedy veteran Carney a well-deserved Best Actor Academy Award, also features Ellen Burstyn, Geraldine Fitzgerald, Larry Hagman, Josh Mostel and Melanie Mayron. Paul Mazursky directs.

The Golden Bowl

2000 - 134 minutes

Wednesday, June 16, 7:15 (PMR)

Another triumph from the producing-directing team of James Ivory and Ismail Merchant, *The Golden Bowl* (adapted from the classic novel by Henry James) pits an American industrialist (Nick Nolte) and his daughter against two well-connected but

impoverished social climbers (Uma Thurman and Jeremy Northam) who'd rather marry for money than lower their station. Together, they engage in a subtle, fascinating dance with misdirection at its heart.

The Narrow Margin

1952 - 72 minutes

Saturday, June 19, 7:15 (PMR)

Film noir staple Charles McGraw stars as hard-boiled cop Walter Brown, who's assigned to transport a mobster's moll (played to perfection by Marie Windsor) from Chicago to Los Angeles -- where she's set to testify before the grand jury. Naturally, danger turns up on the train in the form of syndicate goons sent to silence the witness; trouble is, they have no idea what she looks like. Richard Fleischer helmed this fast-paced crime thriller.

The Wackiest Ship in the Army

1960 - 100 minutes

Wednesday, June 23, 7:15 (PMR)

Lt. Rip Crandall (Jack Lemmon) is assigned to the USS Echo, an aging ship that should have made its last run long ago. Little does Crandall know that he and his crew of misfit soldiers are responsible for secretly transporting an Australian double agent into the depths of enemy territory. Will Crandall and his band of merry men be able to carry out their mission successfully, or will this turn out to be just another botched job?

Cirque du Soleil:

Nouvelle Expérience

1991 - 72 minutes

Saturday, June 26, 7:15 (PMR)

The amazing tightrope walkers, trapeze artists, contortionists, acrobats, fire eaters, jugglers and stilt walkers of Cirque du Soleil gather under the same big top for their renowned 1990-1991 show. The Montreal performance troupe, who wildly reinvented the notion of the circus, performed the seminal *Nouvelle Expérience* for 19 months, during which time they entertained more than 1.3 million audience members.

Susan Hayward won the Best Actress prize at Cannes and earned an Oscar nomination for her stunning portrayal of singer Lillian Roth in this emotional biopic. Deprived of a normal childhood by her pushy stage mother (Jo Van Fleet), Lillian reaches the height of fame while still a teenager. But the pressures of stardom and the death of her childhood sweetheart shortly before their marriage send her on a downward spiral into alcoholism and despair.
